**Perspective-Based Learning:** Student writes from an assigned point of view using specific academic vocabulary **Instructional Conversation:** Students engage in conversation about literature through open-ended dialogue with the teacher or with students in small groups.

Literature Circles: Students form small groups similar to "book clubs" to discuss literature.

**Structured Conversation**: Students are given sentence frames to begin the conversation as well as specific questions and sentence starters for the purpose of elaboration.
