<u>SQP2RS (Squeepers)</u>- Trains students to use cognitive/metacognitive strategies to process nonfiction text

Survey: Students scan the visuals, headings, and other text features.

Question: Students write a list of questions they might answer while reading.

Predict: Students write predictions about what they will learn.

Read: Students read the text.

Respond: Students revisit their questions and think through responses to reading.
