Accountable Conversation Questions: Provide what to say instead of "I Don't Know"

**Expert/Novice:** One student takes on the role of an expert and the other a novice. The expert responds to questions asked by the novice.

Instructional Scaffolding: Teach, model, practice, and apply

**Think, Pair, Sha<mark>re:</mark>** Teacher asks a question and provides wait time; students then a partner and compare

answers

Total Physical Response: Using gestures and movement to make content comprehensible
