CALLA Approach (Cognitive Academic Language Learning Approach): Explicit instruction in language learning strategies, academic content, and language skills through scaffolding, active engaged learning, and language use.

Think-Alouds: Verbalizing thought process

**Brick and Mortar Cards:** Students are given five "brick" words with academic vocabulary and organize them in a way that makes sense. Then link cards together using "mortar" words. <u>(Refer to EL Tip 2.1)</u>

**Formal/Informal Pairs:** Teacher writes a statement on two strips of paper; one with formal English, one with informal English. Teacher distributes strips and students find their matches.
